Skippyjon Jones is a Siamese kitty boy who thinks he's a Chihuahua. He may have big ears, but he has an even BIGGER sense of adventure!







# Learning EMOTIONAL RECOGNITION and EMOTION MANAGEMENT

#### with Jim Panzee

Everyone around Jim Panzee can tell he is grumpy, but he refuses to admit it! Sometimes we don't realize what we are feeling or how our actions appear to others, and it is beneficial to take a moment to assess what is going on. After an outburst, when Jim yells at the other animals that he isn't grumpy, he realizes how he is really feeling. It's okay to feel grumpy, but yelling at friends is not the way to express anger.

Discuss with your students how they can understand and talk about their feelings.


- · What actions or behaviors do they observe?

#### **READ-ALOUD!**

Storytime first! Gather your students around for a storytime with thoughtful questions about adventures and personal experiences.

"Who's been to a beach?"

"What did you do when YOU went to the beach?"

"If you were going on an adventure, where would YOU go?"



#### NOW, EVERYBODY UP!

It's time to dance. Just follow these ten easy steps to get energetic kids movin' and groovin' like Duck & Goose.

- 1. Flap your wings three times.
- 2. Let out a loud goose "HONK!"
- 3. Twitch your tail three times.
- 4. Let's hear a big duck "QUACK!"
- March through the meadow (either march in place or follow a leader around).
- Float on the stream (slow the march down and put your arms out to your sides).

- (Put your hand to your forehead as if you're looking for something in the distance.)
   Call out excitedly, "There's the beach!"
- 8. Run to the water (run in place).
- Splash-dance in the waves (kick your left foot out, then your right). Repeat!
- 10. Last step: Lie down on the warm sand and say, "Ahhhhhhhh."

#### Learning IMPULSE CONTROL

#### with Wordy Birdy

Wordy Birdy is very chatty, and the other animals in the forest have a hard time communicating with her. Being talkative and excitable is not something to be ashamed of, but it is also important to listen and be aware of our surroundings. Wordy Birdy's tendency to talk distracts her from danger! This story teaches readers the importance of taking a second to stop, look around, and listen.

#### **MAKE A CLASSROOM CONTRACT!**

With your students, discuss what behaviors should and should not be expected in the classroom, focusing specifically on speaking and listening skills. Brainstorm some ideas, and have students fill out the Do's and Don't's columns below. # during a UNIque storytime with Uni the Unicorn!

**Before starting the story:** ask kids what they know about unicorns. Have they ever seen or met a unicorn? Do they believe unicorns are real? Explain that in this story, because unicorns have never seen a real-life little girl, they don't believe they exist. Ask the kids if they believe in anything they haven't seen in real life, and to describe what they think the land of unicorns is like.

**As you read:** engage children with questions about the story such as or "How would you feel if Uni walked in right now?" and "Do you think Uni will find the little girl?"

**End the storytime** by asking kids what it means to believe in something. Ask how they felt when they learned that all other unicorns think Uni is silly for believing in little girls. Some other questions you might ask are: "What do you think happens after the end of the book? Do Uni and the girl have a new story to tell after they meet?" or "Do you know anyone who is strong, and smart, and wonderful, like Uni and the girl in this story?"


